Present Continuous Tense (3)

Grammar

When you add -ing to a verb, you have to be careful!

*If the verb ends in a **short vowel** and a **consonant** (hit, run, set, get), you have to double the last consonant, then add -ing.

Wrong: hiting (x)Right: hitting

*If the verb ends in **consonant+e** (sha**re**, ma**ke**, wri**te**), then you don't write the '**e**' when you add –ing.
