

3.7 Count Nouns & Noncount Nouns

With **count nouns**, you use "There is" with singular nouns and "There are" with plural nouns:

Count Nouns

There is a car
There is a leaf
There is a person

There are a few cars
There are many leaves
There are some people



With **noncount nouns**, you only use "There is":

Noncount Nouns

There is a little time
There is a lot of corn
There is some milk

There is some cake
There is much love
There is a lot of money
