

4.8 Future Tense: "going to"

We use the future tense to talk about things that **will happen** after now. There are many ways to talk about the future:

- You can use **will + verb (or won't + verb)**:
 - I **will go** to the supermarket tomorrow.
 - Jackie **won't play** soccer because she is sick.
- You can also use **be verb + going to + verb**:
 - I **am going to walk** to the supermarket tomorrow.
 - Jackie **is not going to play** soccer because she is sick.
