

4.3 Introduction to Passive Voice

Subject - Verb - Object is called active voice.

However, sometimes you can say **Object - Verb - Subject.** This is called the **passive voice.**

To use the **passive voice**, you say:

Object + [Be Verb + Past Participle] + by + Subject

Active Voice: The dog bit the cat.

Passive Voice: The cat was bitten by the dog.

Active Voice: John wrote this novel.

Passive Voice: This novel was written by John.

Active Voice: Marie told me to come to work.

Passive Voice: I was told by Marie to come to work.

^{**}The passive voice is usually past tense, so we usually use was or were.
