

1.4 Past Continuous Tense: "during"

We often use the **past continuous tense** with the word **"during,"** to talk about **two things that were happening at the same time.** Look at this sentence pattern:

[past continuous] during [noun]

We were talking <u>during the movie</u>.

John was looking at his phone <u>during the test</u>.

Were you sleeping <u>during the storm?</u>

Dan and Dana were laughing <u>during the story</u>.

I was thinking a lot <u>during your speech</u>.
