

2.8 Present Perfect Tense: Have Been + Adjective

You can also use **have been + adjective** to make a **present perfect tense** sentence.
(You often use a **time word** like **lately/recently/before** with these sentences.)



I have been married for three years.
John has been tired lately.
We have been busy recently.
Dave and Sarah have been sad for a few days.
