## Am, Is, and Are are verbs, too. Am, Is, and Are are called "be berbs," because they mean "to be."

	He be a boy. (x)Wrong: They be students. (x)He is a boy.Right: They are students.
am	a student / reading / tired
is	a student / sleeping / my friend
are	students / funny / playing a game
	Right: H am is
