Present Continuous Tense (3)

Grammar

When you add -ing to a verb, you have to be careful!

*If the verb ends in a **short vowel** and a **consonant** (**hit**, **run**, **set**, **get**), you have to double the last consonant, then add -ing.

- Wrong: hiting (x)
- Right: hitting

*If the verb ends in **consonant+e** (**share**, **make**, **write**), then you don't write the 'e' when you add -ing.

- Wrong: makeing (x)
- Right: making
